Job Search Tools Mastery

Learn how to navigate the Canadian job market using today's most effective job search platforms. This workshop equips participants how to search strategically, set up job alerts, manage applications, and explore remote and flexible job opportunities while avoiding job-search burnout.

Remote Work Ready Skills

This is an interactive online workshop designed to help participants succeed in virtual work environments. Participants learn practical tools and strategies to enhance productivity, adaptability, and confidence while working remotely.

Careers Transition Strategies

This workshop provides an overview of career transition strategies for newcomers entering the Canadian labour market. Participants will learn how to identify transferable skills, explore alternative career pathways, manage transition risks, and develop a practical career transition plan.

Resume that Stands Out

Participants will learn how to develop a strong, Canadian-style résumé that highlights transferable skills and meets employer expectations. The workshop covers ATS-friendly formatting, customization strategies, and tips for tailoring résumés to specific job postings.

Career Licensing Navigator

This information session supports internationally trained professionals in understanding pathways into regulated professions in Canada. Participants will learn about credential assessment, licensing requirements, bridging programs, and alternative career options while pursuing licensure.

Essential Career Skills

This workshop focuses on the core skills needed to succeed in today's evolving job market. Topics include adaptability, digital and AI-related workplace tools, professional mindset, and practical skills that support long-term employability.

Self-Employment

In collaboration with City of Toronto

This workshop provides an overview of self-employment opportunities in Toronto and Ontario. Participants will learn about starting a small business, legal and tax considerations, and how to develop a simple and practical action plan.

Jobs In-Demand (Job Market GPS)

Navigate Canada's job market with confidence and clarity. This information session equips participants to understand NOC and TEER systems, explore in-demand occupations, and strategically align their international experience and transferable skills with Canadian job opportunities.

Careers in the Healthcare

An information session designed to navigate different careers in healthcare, identify your best fit, exploring the various roles available across clinical, administrative, and support functions, identify key employers, effectively handle the licensing issues and build an effective strategy.

Interview like a Pro

This practical workshop helps participants prepare for job interviews. Learn how to answer common, job specific, culture fit and behavioral interview questions using the STAR method, master interviews practicing mock interview.

Career Reboot & Reinvention

This workshop equips participants to identify transferable skills, explore career pivot strategies, and take practical steps toward rebuilding confidence while creating a clear and realistic career action plan.
